

Name: Kennebunk Free Library Location: Kennebunk, Maine Membership: SLCP Public Library





The Kennebunk Free Library in Maine has a unique program to combat loneliness, build community connections, and help animals in need: a cat foster program!

Kicking off in June 2023, the library built a community partnership with the Animal Welfare Society of Maine. In exchange for cats to provide patrons with companionship during their library visits, the library serves as a satellite adoption site that encourages patrons to "adopt don't shop" and provides the animal with a much more comfortable environment than in a traditional shelter setting, allowing their personalities to shine.

In July of 2025, the library celebrated its 50<sup>th</sup> adoption: Milo, pictured top left.

In total, the library has fostered 55 cats and counting! Glory, pictured bottom right, is currently in residence.

Using social media platforms, the library keeps patrons up to date on the current feline resident and all adoption success stories.

The program also caught the attention of News Center Maine, who did a feature on the library celebrating its success and further spreading the word on where those in the Kennebunk community can go to make a new furry friend. In the video, the library's Assistant Director Allison Atkins remarks,



"There are lots of stereotypes about librarians that are not true, but the librarian and cat stereotype is absolutely true."

## Strategic Climate Communication: Insights and Tools for Effective Strategies

Thursday, October 23 @ 2:00 pm EDT

Communicating effectively on climate change can seem like a daunting task - especially in this polarized environment. Effective climate communicators know that the first rule of communication is to know your audience. In this session, Mallika Talwar from the Yale Program on Climate Change Communication (YPCCC) will share how local institutions such as libraries can leverage public opinion data and messaging insights to better understand their communities and craft communication strategies that resonate with diverse audiences. We will explore how YPCCC's research and tools can be applied to effectively educate, engage, and empower local audiences to take action on climate change.

Join Red Hook Public Library's Director, Alex Geller, for an engaging presentation on how to develop a Naturalist-in-Residence program for your library. Inspired by artist- and writer-in-residence models, Red Hook's Naturalist-in-Residence brings a local ecologist into the library and around the community to lead hands-on workshops and presentations to connect your community with its natural surroundings.

In this session, Alex will walk participants through the development and evolution of Red Hook's Naturalist-in-Residence program, from initial concept to successful implementation. You'll gain practical insight into program structure, budgeting, community partnerships, and how to identify and work with naturalists in your area. Learn how to adapt the model to your community's landscape, whether you're in a small town, suburban neighborhood, or urban environment.
