Curtis Memorial Library's Library of Things is an impressive collection of over 1500 unique items that can checked out for use by their patrons.

The Library of Things (LOT) was created to support the local needs, missing literacies, and community programming of Curtis Memorial Library in addition to the global Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

The library has been featured in news outlets on several occasions for its LOT in the last few months including NBC News, The Today Show, and the New York Times.

"We've seen strangers bond over similarities of cooking special occasion meals at checkout, hosted a room full of patrons learning to process acorns for 'cheez' and muffins, and overheard detailed recipe exchanges of seaweed tortillas and elderberry popsicles. You never know what type of interactions a food literacy collection will inspire," said Hazel Onsrud, Adult Services Librarian and coordinator of the project.

### Resilient Communities: Advancing Sustainability in and through Libraries



The Sustainable Libraries Initiative (SLI) is partnering with the American Library Association (ALA) to offer a learning opportunity supporting sustainability as a core value of librarianship.

**One-hundred public library workers** will be selected to complete "Sustainable Librarianship: Core Competencies and Practices," a four-part asynchronous ecourse. In addition to **free tuition** for the course, participants will engage in a community of practice with advisors and peers over the course of six months.

# The Sustainable Libraries Initiative Partners with the Michigan Library Association





A new partnership between the Sustainable Libraries Initiative (SLI) and the Michigan Library Association (MLA) aims to equip MLA members with tools and resources to address the challenges and mitigate the impact of climate change.

Through this partnership, MLA joins 8 other states including Iowa, Maine, Maryland, Massachusetts, New Jersey, New York, Vermont, and Virginia in committing to sustainability by ensuring access to sustainability tools, webinars, vendors, program ideas, and educational materials.

"Our partnership with the Sustainable Libraries Initiative (SLI) is ensuring Michigan libraries have access to valuable sustainability resources and coursework, which aim to help libraries become more environmentally sound," said Dillon Geshel, Interim Executive Director of the Michigan Library Association. "We're thrilled help empower libraries to make intentional choices that limit their environmental impact, and the SLI resources do just that."

A number of Michiganders have already joined the SLI community of practice, including the East Lansing Public Library, which is blazing a trail in the state as an early adopter of the Sustainable Library Certification Program.

Members of the Michigan Library Association who opt-in via the SLI website will receive one free year of annual membership to the Sustainable Libraries Initiative and a 20% discount on the award-winning Sustainable Library Certification Program. Cohorts of five or more libraries will receive a 25% discount on certification, supporting the principle that there is power in collective action.


