Name: Comsewogue Public Library

**Location: Port Jefferson Station, New York**

In partnership with a town councilman and the Long Island Bicycle Cooperative, Comsewogue Public Library became an early adopter of the Bike Borrow Program: a function of the NYS Department of Transportation's Statewide Mobility Services Program that brings resources and technical assistance to

disadvantaged communities. The library serves a community with a substantial concentration of multi-family homes and a lack of public transportation. The initiative hopes to provide more job access and health and recreation opportunities to its users. With the bike borrow program, patrons 18 years of age and older may borrow a bicycle from the library for up to two weeks with nothing but a liability waiver and their library card. The library's nonprofit partner manages any maintenance and repair of the bicycles, easing the responsibilities of library staff.


"The Bike Borrow Program will help fill transportation needs and lets residents engage in cycling for recreation and health. This program for adult members of the Library is equitable, sustainable, and made possible through local and regional partnerships," said Comsewogue Public Library Director Debbie Engelhardt.

## The Sustainable Libraries Initiative Partners with the Delaware Library Association



A new partnership between the Sustainable Libraries Initiative (SLI) and the Delaware Library Association (DLA) aims to equip DLA members with tools and resources to address the challenges and mitigate the impact of climate change.

Through this partnership, DLA joins 9 other states including Iowa, Maine, Maryland, Massachusetts, Michigan, New Jersey, New York, Vermont, and Virginia in committing to sustainability by ensuring access to sustainability tools, webinars, vendors, program ideas, and educational materials.

"The Delaware Library Association is excited to join a growing community of library workers that are collaborating and learning in a space dedicated to sustainability and the triple bottom line," said Scott Businsky, President of the Delaware Library Association. "Our partnership with the Sustainable Libraries Initiative will help libraries in Delaware create thriving communities throughout our state."
