# MEMBER SPOTLIGHT

**Name:** Middle Country Public Library

**Location:** Centereach, New York

**Membership:** SLCP Public Library



The Middle Country Public Library has established an impressive toy library to live sustainable values out loud and support the youth and families in its community.



The toy library – approximately 300 items strong – reduces waste, saves families money, exemplifies a circular economy, promotes learning and accessibility, helps build skills in literacy, and supports cognitive growth in the library's littlest patrons.

In a "try-before-you-buy" model, the library loans out high-quality, classic toys with a library card: just the same as any book. Upon return, the toys are cleaned and returned to the collection. Toys include items such as blocks, manipulatives, infant toys, learning games, puzzles, musical instruments, trucks, and imaginative play sets.

The library also has a special collection of adaptive toys to support children with physical, developmental, or sensory needs and include items such as calming weighted lap toys, sensory tools, and switch-activated toys.



In addition, the Middle Country Public Library houses a Sensory Nook: a uniquely designed workspace that establishes a more inclusive environment by providing a safe place for self-regulation through sensory experiences.



The Sensory Nook is open to all children with their caregivers, though it is especially important for making learning more accessible for neurodivergent individuals and those with sensory processing disorders who may be uncomfortable or find it challenging to be productive in traditional library workspaces.
