In the month of January, SLI had the opportunity to attend **LibLearnX** -- a conference hosted by the American Library Association. This year, the conference occurred between January 19th and January 22nd in Baltimore, Maryland.

Highlights:

- SLI operated a booth at the conference! Representatives of our organization discussed our work with visitors who stopped by to say hello!
- SLI's Rebekkah Smith Aldrich, Jennifer Ferriss, Lisa G. Kropp, and Matt Bollerman presented "All Jobs are Climate Jobs: Why Library Workers need to be Climate Action Leaders" on Saturday at the conference.
 - some topics discussed include: how to reduce greenhouse gases in libraries; sustainable community programs and outreach; forming partnerships with local environmental organizations; how to improve diversity, equity, and inclusion; how to improve sustainability within the library setting; and ideas on how to educate a community on sustainable practices.

The symposium is part of a project (Building Resilient Communities) funded by the National Science Foundation and led by the Space Science Institute and its STAR Library Network. Project partners include OCLC WebJunction, University of North Carolina Greensboro, and Interactive Learning Dynamics. The focus of the survey is on public library STEM learning programs and activities related to climate change science, climate change's impacts on public health, and community sustainability and/or resiliency.
