Name: Alice L. Pendelton Library

Location: Islesboro, Maine

Taking advantage of its beautiful outdoor spaces, Alice L. Pendelton Library utilizes the space for good: bringing environmentally, socially, and financially sustainable practices to the surrounding community with a variety of gardens and programming.

Stormwater runoff is well taken care of on library grounds. A gravel parking lot, rain barrels, well drained roof runoff, and brick walkways inlaid with porous material allow precipitation to infiltrate the ground on every inch of library property, ensuring replenishment of the underlying aquifer and avoiding the transportation of contaminants from human activity into the surrounding sea.

The library also prides itself on its two well-kept gardens: a Children's Garden that is also used as an activity space, and their Remembrance Garden, the only public garden in Islesboro, where community members can contribute memorials to loved ones and enjoy the peaceful outdoors.



"The benefits of the action items in this section to the library have been huge. Our Remembrance Garden was overgrown, not very welcoming, and included invasive species. Now it's completely redesigned, by a professional garden landscaper and community member, and includes more open spaces, clear walking paths, more seating, more native plants and no invasive species. The library would not have undertaken this wonderful project without undertaking the SLCP," said Library Director Melissa Olsen.

The library's gardens, taken care of largely by the Friends of Alice L. Pendelton Library, are biocide free and are maintained by pulling weeds, hand-watering, and mowing larger areas.

The Children's Garden is often utilized for programming. Some programs conducted in the space include a petting zoo, pumpkin carving, and outdoor movies.

Climate change is one of the grandest challenges facing our generation. The National Climate Action Strategy for Libraries was announced in 2024 by the American Library Association in partnership with the awardwinning Sustainable Libraries Initiative in order to provide guidance and tools to help expedite climate action work in libraries. From working to reduce the impact library operations have on future climate change, to the pressing need for work to adapt in the face of the predicted impacts of climate change, to how to ensure climate action is done through a justice lens—the strategy helps library stakeholders better understand the context of decisions that will be made at your library in the coming years and how you can be a catalyst for positive change at your library and in your community. In addition to rolling out the strategy itself, a practical implementation guide with definitions, examples, and simple steps to get started was also released.
