ABOUT







Meadowview Elementary is one of 12 elementary schools in Eau Claire Area School District (ECASD), serving over 10,000 students in Wisconsin. There are three middle schools, two high schools, two charter schools, and one virtual school in ECASD. Eau Claire is located approximately 90 miles east of Minneapolis.

Meadowview students include students who are: 75% White, 5% Hispanic or Latino, 8% Asian, 4% Black or African American, and 8% Two or More Races. Fifteen percent of Meadowview students have identified disabilities. Thirty-four percent of Meadowview students are identified as economically disadvantaged. Four percent of Meadowview students are English learners.

Meadowview Elementary was built in 1990; the library is 2,500 square feet in the center of the school, dividing the primary hallway from the intermediate hallway and the main office from the gym and cafeteria.

SUSTAINABLE LIBRARIES INITIATIVE

Dr. Jacqueline D. Liesch joined the Sustainable Libraries Certification Program (SLCP) in September 2024. She was drawn to the program after earning her Ed.D. from the University of Wisconsin-Stevens Point in May of that year.

The program uses the same definition of sustainability as the Ed.D. program, focusing on environmental stewardship, economic sustainability, and social equity.

Dr. Liesch worked during the 2024-2025 school year to examine, plan, and offer collaborative teaching, an inclusive collection, and engaging programming.
