# MEMBER SPOTLIGHT

Name: Melissa A. King

Location: Gaithersburg, Maryland Membership: SLCP School Librarian



School librarian Melissa King fosters a love of learning about the environment in her students and helps them build environmental literacy skills through partnerships, immersive programming, and experiential learning.



Originally joining the Sustainable Library Certification Program (SLCP) to support the school's status as a Maryland Green School, Melissa sponsors the Flower Hill Elementary School Green Team and introduces sustainability topics in fun and innovative ways.

As part of the Green Team's work, her students conduct campus-cleanups; manage a pollinator garden; build and monitor bluebird boxes; monitor water samples from a neighborhood pond; harvest lettuce grown in their garden as part of the Nature Forward's Salad Science Program, combining the fresh greens with a rainbow of fruits and veggies, and having a Salad Party; among other learning activities.

Hands-on, experiential learning opportunities create an atmosphere for her students to develop lifelong skills and love for the natural world. One notable program was the *Emma* and the Bees bilingual book walk from Syncretic Press in which Melissa set up in the school's courtyard. The book walk was donated to Montgomery County Public Schools Outdoor Education Department by Conservation Nation. To enhance the experience, Melissa also reached out to a local beekeeper that provided honey for tasting and some equipment to demonstrate beekeeping.

Also important are the partnerships Melissa has formed with local organizations to bring additional resources to her students of all ages on the topics of nature, agriculture, wildlife, mindfulness, sustainability and energy conservation.

### The Sustainable Libraries Initiative Partners with the Maryland Library Association



A new partnership between the Sustainable Libraries Initiative (SLI) and the Maryland Library Association (MLA) aims to equip MLA members with tools and resources to address the challenges and mitigate the impact of climate change.

Through this partnership, MLA joins 7 other states including in committing to sustainability by ensuring access to sustainability tools, webinars, vendors, program ideas, and educational materials.

"We are very excited to work more closely with MLA and enable all of their members to accelerate their adoption of practices that will help them live their values out loud while adapting in the face of climate change," said Rebekkah Smith Aldrich, SLI Board President. "Positioning the Maryland library community as leaders in this conversation will allow them to follow the lead of hundreds of other libraries in our program, a strong move to ensure libraries contribute to their community's resilience and remain relevant and responsive institutions."

A number of Marylanders are already blazing a trail in their state as early adopters of the Sustainable Library Certification Program, including School Librarian Melissa King (see member spotlight) and the soon-to-be certified University of Maryland Libraries.

Members of the Maryland Library Association who opt-in via the SLI website will receive one free year of annual membership to the Sustainable Libraries Initiative and a 20% discount on the award-winning Sustainable Library Certification Program. Cohorts of five or more libraries will receive a 25% discount on certification, supporting the principle that there is power in collective action. ## Claudia Depkin Steps Down After a Decade of Service to the SLI Advisory Board

Claudia Depkin is stepping down from the Sustainable Libraries Initiative's Advisory Board after a decade of dedicated service to the project. Claudia is one of the original co-creators of the SLI! She was present at the very first retreat held at the Carey Institute for Global Good in 2015 from which the project emerged.



Claudia's service has helped to shape a community of practice that has grown to encompass thousands of library workers across the globe and the creation of the award-winning Sustainable Library Certification Program. Claudia did not just advise on these projects but is a practitioner herself, leading her own library, the Haverstraw King's Daughters Public Library, where she is the director, to complete the Sustainable Library Certification Program in 2022.

In 2019, Claudia was recognized nationally for her efforts on the topic of sustainability when she was named a <u>Library Journal Mover & Shaker</u>, in her M&S profile article she noted, "I've got to walk the walk if I'm going to talk the talk!" Claudia remains committed to the work of the SLI, and will continue to serve as a mentor to several libraries in the Sustainable Library Certification Program and as a member of the SLI Advisory Board's Community of Practice & User Experience Committee.

The Advisory Board extends its sincere gratitude to Claudia for her service to not only the SLI but to our profession. Claudia has exemplified dignified, pragmatic, and professional leadership alongside her colleagues which has inspired thousands of library professionals across the planet.


